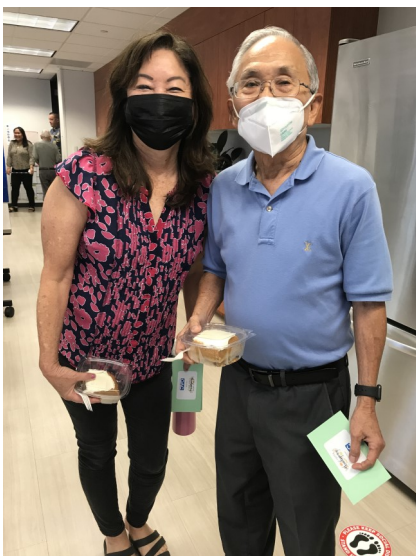
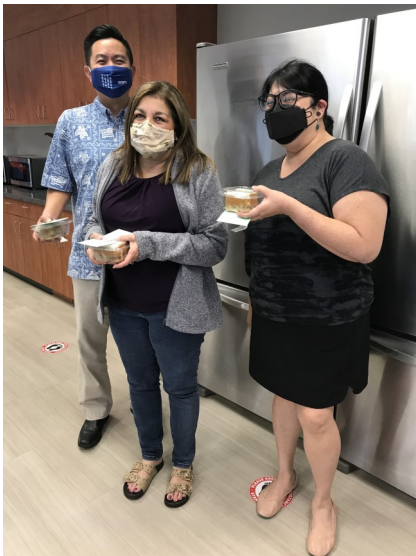

## Rise & Grind Café

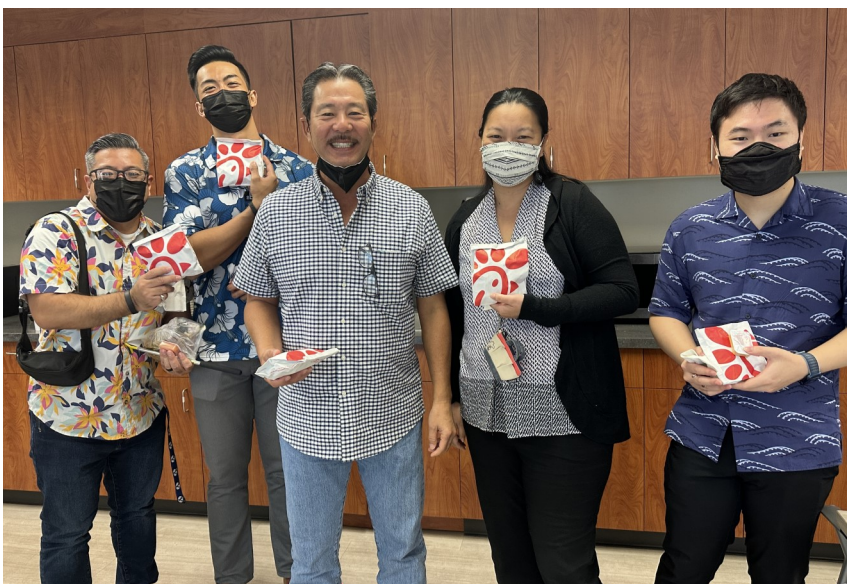
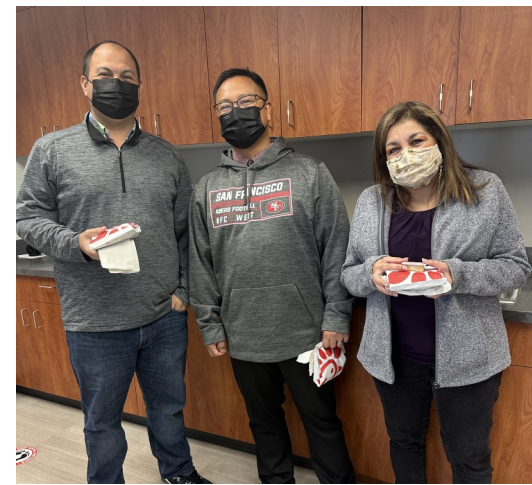
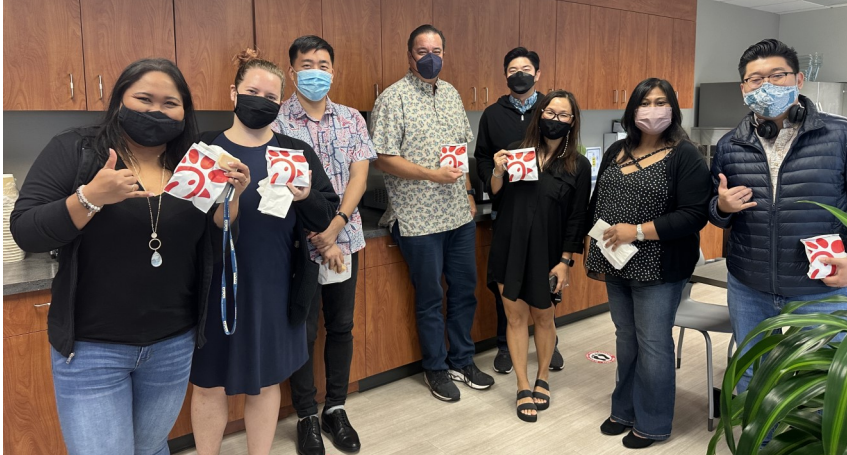

## Holiday Safety

The season of giving is now upon us but unfortunately the season of taking is also here. The number of thefts increase during the holiday season which is a reason for concern. According to the 2021 Honolulu Police Department (HPD) Annual Report, thefts increased from 17,843 incidents in 2020 to 20,079 incidents in 2021. However, there are many more thefts which go unreported. To reduce the chances of becoming a victim, here are some helpful tips:

1. With online shopping becoming so popular, it is very common to see the increased presence of delivery trucks in the neighborhood. Monitor when your packages are expected to arrive and don't let the delivered items sit at your front door for an extended period.
2. Build a relationship with your neighbors who are home during the day. Consider asking them to collect your delivered package if you are not home.
3. Keep your valuables out-of-sight. Whether at home or the shopping mall, it's important to keep bags and packages out-of-sight. If you are shopping, do not put recent purchases in the back seat of your car where they are visible.
4. Be sure to lock your doors for your car and home. Also, lock the windows on the ground level of your home.
5. Pay attention to your surroundings and be vigilant. Before leaving your car and store, scan the area. Take out earbuds and avoid texting or making a phone call until you are safely in the store or in your car. Distracted shoppers become easy targets.
6. Install motion activated outdoor lighting for your house to light up surroundings. If the entry points to your home are illuminated, it may decrease the chances of a burglar targeting your home.
